IN-TEXT CITATION GENERAL RULES

The American Psychological Association reference style uses the Author-Date format. When quoting directly or indirectly from a source, the source must be acknowledged in the text by author's name and year of publication. There are two ways of citing in text from a source; direct and indirect. This can be accomplished by either;

- 1. Making it a part of the sentence or
- 2. Putting it in parentheses at the end of the sentence

REFERENCE LIST GENERAL RULES

- APA style requires **double spacing** throughout e.g. text, references, etc.
- All citations must be in the **Hanging Indent Format** with the first line flush to the left margin and all other lines indented (one-half inch or five spaces).
- Reference list entries should be **alphabetized** by the last name of the first author (or editor) of each work.
- Each bibliographic entry must end with a **full stop.**
- Titles of books, journal names, periodical names, theses title, technical report titles, or any major work must be **italicized.**
- Titles of journal articles, book chapters must **not be italicized, underlined, or have quotation marks** put around them.
